Guest Speaker, Loran Steinlage, farms in West Union, IA and is known for his cover crop interseeding and soil health practices

The Land Stewardship Project will host Loran Steinlage of West Union, IA to discuss his no-till farming operation of 750 acres of corn, soybeans and some small grains. After 10 years of cover crop experimentation, Loran has become well respected in northeastern lowa for his innovative work with V6 interseeding and relay cropping, growing multiple crops at once. His interseeding mix—"the jungle mix" as he calls it—is varied but can include radish, rape, vetch, several clovers, buckwheat, phacelia, flax, oats and more. Loran will share his homemade interseeder design that can precision, double-row drill his cover crops and apply fertilizer. He is even growing and harvesting his own cover crop seed. Farmer Workshop on Cover Crops, No-Till and More:

On Fri. Feb. 16th from 10-2 at St. Columban Church in Preston, farmer presenter Loran Steinlage of West Union, IA will be the guest speaker for a workshop focusing on building soil health with cover crops, interseeding, and more. Group discussions and short presentations by local farmers on their soil building practices will be included.

Southeast Minnesota Farmer Panel:

- John Meyer of Stewartville recently transitioned to no-till on his row crop acres and is
 experimenting with companion crops, frost seeding oats as a spring cover crop, and he
 seeded all his acres to cover crops this fall with cereal rye before soybeans and a cover
 crop mix before corn.
- Rick Sommerfield of Mazeppa strip and no-tills corn and soybeans. Rick has been using
 winter wheat, cereal rye, and cover crops mixes for to build organic matter and increase
 his soil health. He is also looking to build his own cover crop seed broadcaster for V6
 interseeding.
- **Dean Richards** farms near St. Charles and Mabel. He raises beef, certified organic row crops, hay, small grains. Dean is growing cover crops, wheat, rye, clover and turnips, to extend his grazing season, and he has also begun composting beef manure.
