Farmer Panelists in Lewiston:

Luke Bergler, Ridgeway—Luke rotationally grazes cow/calf, and grows row crops, hay, sorghum and cover crops. Luke uses minimum tillage and is experimenting with planting soybeans into 4' tall winter rye.

Bob Christie & DJ Mueller, St. Charles—Father-in-law & son-in-law working to incorporate no-till and cover crops on their crop and livestock farm. Bob & DJ will share their story of working together to make changes for the betterment of the farm.

Farmer Panelists in Faribault:

Jared Luhman, Goodhue—Jared and his father raise beef, hay, pasture, cover crops (small grains & summer annuals), organic corn and edible black beans. Jared has been using practices like cover crop & mob grazing, stockpiling forage for winter grazing & using the roller-crimper to improve soil, suppress weeds & turn a profit.

Matt Alford, Blue Earth—Matt Alford & his family raise corn, soybeans and cover crops, in Faribault county. Matt is interseeding a multi-species mix into standing corn, & fall planting a hairy vetch-triticale mix following beans.
