Soil Health Resources:

Forever Green EECO now enrolling for fall 2024 planting: This program offers ecosystem service incentive payments for Minnesota growers producing Kernza, hybrid winter rye, winter barley, and winter camelina. It also covers up to half the cost of production on the back-end in the event of a crop or market failure.

Integrating Crops & Livestock Infographic (Green Lands Blue Waters): This infographic is intended to illustrate a spectrum of options for farmers wishing to capture the benefits of integrating livestock into a cropping operation. Benefits include availability of a low-cost carbon-dense nutrient source from livestock waste, the potential to stack multiple enterprises, sharing equipment and partnering with neighbors, and reducing soil and nutrient loss from runoff.
