With robes that gleam with sunny sheen




Kernza 101: A Promising Perennial

Beginning and prospective farmers are invited to apply to LSP's Farm Beginnings, a year-long training program that focuses on the goal-setting, marketing, and financial skills needed to establish a successful farm business. The class will run from December 2025 through March 2026, with some additional educational opportunities to take place later in 2026. The deadline for applications is **September 1**. Scholarships will be available.

Soil Health Financial Assistance Program Grants

The Soil Health Financial Assistance Grant provides costshare funds for the purchase and retrofitting of soil health equipment. Adopting soil health practices often requires expensive and specific pieces of equipment, creating a need for a cost-share opportunity to offset those costs. The application for the Fiscal Year 2026 Soil Health Financial Assistance Grant is open until August 29.

Cover Crop Financial Benchmarking Cohort

The Minnesota Farm Business Management (FBM) program is partnering with Environmental Defense Fund, General Mills, and the U of M's Office for Soil Health and Center for Farm Financial Management to provide financial benchmarking of Minnesota farms growing cover crops. The program aims to provide farmers growing cover crops with a three-year FBM scholarship to establish a first-of-its-kind cover crop financial benchmarking dataset that can be expanded over time. Through this program, farmers growing cover crops in Minnesota can receive a \$100 to \$150 percredit scholarship (50%-75% cost share) for participating in FBM.


